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On April 2, 2010—Good Friday—a German Bundeswehr platoon was ambushed by Taliban forces near Isa Khel in northern Afghanistan. What followed was one of the most intense and controversial engagements involving German troops since World War II.

The Good Friday Battle tells this story for the first time in full detail—through the voices of those who were there.

Based on more than 70 hours of interviews with 24 participants, the book reconstructs the battle from multiple perspectives: German soldiers on the ground, American pilots in the air, and the chain of command under pressure. At its center stands a critical moment—when U.S. Army Chief Warrant Officer Jason LaCrosse and his fellow pilots made a decision that went beyond orders, risking their careers to save German lives under fire.

The result is a fast-paced, deeply human account of combat, leadership, and allied trust under extreme conditions.
