Bio

Wolf Gregis is a German Afghanistan veteran, bestselling author, and public voice on military and veteran affairs.

Born in 1981 in Wismar, Germany, he grew up in Schwerin and now lives in Rostock. He served in the Bundeswehr and deployed to Afghanistan in 2008 and 2009, with assignments in Mazar-e-Sharif and Kabul.

After his military service, Gregis studied German literature, history, education, and communication sciences in Rostock and earned a doctorate in the humanities. He later worked as a teacher of German and history and in teacher training. Today, he works in science communication while continuing his work as an author, media voice, and advocate for German veterans.

Gregis is the author of *Das Karfreitagsgefecht*, the German original of *The Good Friday Battle*. The book reconstructs the battle of April 2, 2010 near Isa Khel in northern Afghanistan, based on interviews, combat footage, maps, and operational material.

He is also the creator and host of *Helm ab – Der Veteranencast*, one of Germany's most influential independent formats on military life, veterans, and security culture. His work focuses on combat experience, remembrance, military culture, and the gap between soldiers and civil society.

With *The Good Friday Battle*, Gregis brings the German soldiers' perspective to an international audience — and tells the story of one of the Bundeswehr's most significant combat engagements through the voices of those who were there.

Jeff Montrose is an American Iraq War veteran, former U.S. Army infantry officer, author, and translator.

He has lived in Germany for more than two decades and works at the intersection of military experience, ethics, security policy, and transatlantic understanding. His own writing includes *In der Wüste des Wahnsinns (In the Desert of Madness)*, a memoir reflecting on the psychological consequences of modern combat.

Montrose brings a rare dual perspective to *The Good Friday Battle*: he understands the U.S. military world from the inside, while also being deeply familiar with German military culture, German veterans, and Germany's difficult public relationship with the Afghanistan War.

For the English-language edition, Montrose helps carry the German story into an American context — preserving the experience of the soldiers on the ground while making the military, cultural, and emotional stakes accessible to U.S. readers.

The Good Friday Battle is built on a German battlefield story and an American rescue story.

Wolf Gregis brings the research, interviews, and German veteran perspective. Jeff Montrose brings the American military lens, language, and cultural bridge needed to make the story resonate with U.S. readers.

Together, they tell a story about German soldiers trapped in a Taliban ambush, American pilots flying into danger to save them, and the fragile trust that holds coalition warfare together under fire.
